# Tampa Bay Lightning: Head Coach and Player Bios

## Head Coach: Jon Cooper

Cooper was named Tampa Bay's eighth head coach on March 26, 2013.

Cooper, 49, begins his fifth season as Lightning head coach and has amassed a 146-90-25 record entering 2016-17. Cooper's .607 win percentage is the highest in franchise history. He earned NHL victory No. 100 on April 11, 2015, making him the fifth-fastest coach among those who debuted in the NHL since 2000 to reach the mark. He led the Bolts to the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his three full seasons as head coach, including back-to-back Eastern Conference Finals (2015, 2016) and a Stanley Cup Final (2015). He was a finalist for the Jack Adams Award in 2014, given annually to the NHL's top coach. Cooper joined the Lightning after spending the previous three seasons behind the bench of Tampa Bay's top minor league affiliates, the Norfolk Admirals (2010-12) and the Syracuse Crunch (2012-13), compiling a 133-62-26 (.661) record in 221 AHL games. Cooper's NHL head coaching debut came with the Lightning on March 29, 2013.

## **IGGY TIES MacINNIS FOR 35TH IN POINTS**

Jarome Iginla's goal on Monday in Pittsburgh marked his 1,274th career point, tying Al MacInnis for 35th place on the NHL's all-time scoring list. It was his 191st career power-play tally, passing Pierre Turgeon (190) for sole possession of 21st all-time. Iginla is beginning his 20th NHL season. Here's a look at where he ranks in NHL history:

- Ranks 16th on the NHL's all-time goal-scoring list (612), just 13 behind Joe Sakic (625) for 15th. His 612 goals rank second among active players to Jaromir Jagr (749).
- With 1,274 career points, Iginla needs just 26 to become the 34th player in League history to reach 1,300. He is currently tied with Al MacInnis for 35th on the all-time points list, seven shy of Alex Delvecchio (1,281) for 34th. Only two active players have more points: Jagr (1,869) and Joe Thornton (1,346).
- Needs 23 games to become the 16th player in NHL history to skate in 1,500 contests. His 1,477 career games rank second among active players (Jagr 1,632). He passed Doug Gilmour (1,474) for sole possession of 20th place on the all-time list in the season opener against Dallas on Oct. 15.
- Ranks fourth among active players in career assists (662), placing him 61st all-time.
- Has scored 97 career game-winning goals, tied with Guy Lafleur for eighth place on the all-time list. His next game winner will match him with Bobby Hull (98) for seventh.
- Ranks 21st on the all-time power-play goals list with 191. Only Jagr (133) has more GWG and only Jagr (209) and Alex Ovechkin (196) have more PPG among active players.
- Needs 11 penalty minutes to reach 1,000; only eight players in NHL history have scored 600 goals and amassed over 1,000 PIM.

### **BACK-TO-BACK**

Colorado just wrapped up the first of its 11 back-to-back games, winning in Pittsburgh before falling in Washington. The Avalanche played 10 back-to-back sets in 2015-16, finishing 6-3-1 in the first game and 6-4-0 in the second. Over their final five back-to-backs (so 10 games total), the Avs posted a 7-3-0 overall record, 4-1-0 on the first night and 3-2-0 on the second.

### **JOE GOAL-BORNE**

Joe Colborne recorded his first career hat trick in the Avalanche's 6-5 season-opening victory over the Dallas Stars on Saturday. A look at Colborne's notable evening:

- Became the second player in Avalanche history to score a hat trick on Opening Night, joining Paul Stastny, who tallied three goals in the 2007-08 opener vs. Dallas (Oct. 3, 2007). Colborne was the fifth player in franchise history to score a hat trick on Opening Night.
- Was the first Avalanche player to record a hat trick in his debut with the team. Was the second player in franchise history to have a hat trick in his first game with the club, as Real Cloutier scored three times in the Quebec Nordiques' inaugural game on Oct. 10, 1979 against the Atlanta Flames.
- Was the first Avs player to score two goals in the first period of season opener since Joe Sakic on Oct 10, 1998 vs Ottawa.

### **BARRIE PASSES OZO IN GAME WINNERS**

Tyson Barrie scored his 12th career game-winning goal in Saturday's victory over the Dallas Stars, passing Sandis Ozolinsh (11) for the most GWG by a defenseman in franchise history.

### **LIGHT OCTOBER**

The Avs have only seven games in October (two at home), their fewest ever in this particular month.

### **TOUGH START**

The Avalanche's first five opponents to start the season are in order: the Central Division champions (Dallas), the Stanley Cup champions (Pittsburgh), the Presidents' Trophy winners (Washington), a team that has reached the Conference Final in each of the last two seasons (Tampa Bay) and the Atlantic Division champions (Florida).

### **HERE'S TO THE NEW BOSS**

Jared Bednar was hired on Aug. 25, 2016, becoming the seventh head coach in Avalanche history and the 15th in franchise history. Bednar, 44, guided the Columbus Blue Jackets' American Hockey League affiliate, the Lake Erie Monsters, to the 2016 Calder Cup as AHL champions last season. The 2016-17 campaign marks Bednar's 15th season in professional coaching and his seventh as a head coach. He posted a 251-158-42 (.603) combined record in his four years as an AHL head coach and two years as ECHL head coach. He guided the South Carolina Stingrays to the 2009 Kelly Cup as ECHL champions.

### **SUCCESS ON OPENING NIGHT**

Colorado's 6-5 victory on Opening Night improved the franchise's record to 20-10-7 in season openers (.635), the second-best mark in the NHL behind Tampa Bay (15-7-2 .667). The Avalanche/Nordiques are now 25-8-4 all-time in home openers (.730). Colorado is 13-5-3 in home openers since moving from Quebec, which includes a 11-4-2 mark at Pepsi Center.

## IRONMEN

Carl Soderberg owns the longest active ironman streak on the team at 172 consecutive games, a career high. Jarome Iginla ranks second at 167 straight games. Iginla has dressed in all 82 games in each of his two years with the Avalanche and in 11 seasons overall, the most 82-game campaigns in NHL history.

## AVS FINISH 6-0 IN PRESEASON

The Avalanche finished 6-0-0 during the preseason, the NHL's only unbeaten team in exhibition play. It marked Colorado's first unblemished preseason mark since at least 2002. Mikhail Grigorenko led the Avs with four goals (4g/0a) and shared the team points lead with Rene Bourque (1g/3a). Grigorenko's four goals, in fact, tied for the League lead. Semyon Varlamov finished second among NHL goaltenders in save percentage (.978) and goals-against average (0.67), while Calvin Pickard ranked sixth (.962) and eighth (1.20) respectively in those categories. The Avs finished 23-for-23 on the penalty kill, joining San Jose (24/24) as the only two teams to not allow a power-play goal.

## STRONG IN SHOOTOUTS

The Avalanche finished 4-0 in shootouts last season, the league's only unbeaten team in the tiebreaker. The Avs, who led all clubs with 10 shootout wins the previous season (10-4 in 2014-15), have now won nine consecutive shootouts, one shy of the franchise record set March 19, 2011 to Jan. 2, 2012. The Avs are 41-13 in their last 54. Semyon Varlamov is 27-14 in career shootouts with a .752 save percentage. Varly's .752 Sv% is tied for the highest all-time (min 100 att), matching Mathieu Garon and Johan Hedberg. He is 23-8 in 31 shootouts as a member of the Avalanche, stopping .771 (96/22). As a team, the Avs own the highest shooting percentage in league history (39.7), and third-highest save percentage (.718).

# Colorado Avalanche: Head Coach and Player Bios

## Head Coach: Jared Bednar

- Was named head coach of the Avalanche on Aug. 25, 2016 and begins his first season in this role.
- Is the seventh head coach in Avalanche history and the 15th in franchise history.
- Earned the victory in his NHL head coaching debut on Oct. 15 vs. Dallas.
- Bednar, 44, guided the Columbus Blue Jackets' American Hockey League affiliate, the Lake Erie Monsters, to the 2016 Calder Cup as AHL champions last season.
- The 2016-17 campaign marks Bednar's 15th season in professional coaching and his seventh as a head coach.
- Posted a 251-158-42 (.603) combined record behind the bench, which included four years in the AHL and two seasons in the ECHL.
- Led the South Carolina Stingrays to the 2009 Kelly Cup as ECHL champions.
- Played nine seasons of professional hockey, a career that spanned parts of six seasons in the ECHL, parts of three seasons in the AHL and one season in the IHL.
- The defenseman was part of two Kelly Cup championship teams as a player, 1997 and 2001 with South Carolina.

- Ranks 21st on the all-time power-play goals list with 191.
- Needs 11 penalty minutes to reach 1,000.
